Single Day-Cultural and Land Based Learning Programs

Land based learning activities are seasonally based and include: deer skinning/tanning, maple syrup harvesting, trapping and shoreline fishing. Other cultural activities include; Storytelling- Creation Story and Constellations, drum & craft making, live theater by Debajehmujig Theater Group and Indigenous culinary. Our school group packages are fully customizable to meet your learning objectives.

9:00am	Depart Manitoulin Hotel & Conference Centre. Travel to Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory
9:30am	Arrive 1836 historic site: Met by Wikwemikong Tourism step-on guides
9:35am-10:45am	The Unceded Journey guided tour: learn the history of Odawa Mnis (Manitoulin Island) and Wiikwemkoong Unceded Territory—Canada’s only officially recognized Unceded Territory. Includes stops at historic sites including 1836 Treaty historic site, Holy Cross Mission Ruins (residential school site)
11:00am-12:00pm	Student Engagement with Local High-school
12:00pm-1:00pm	Catered lunch: Authentic Indigenous Cuisine
1:15pm-3:15pm	Bebamikawe “Making Footprints”: An interpretive hike through the ecologically diverse Bebamikawe Memorial Trail while learning about plants harvested for edibility and medicinal purposes. Forage for natural ingredients that will be used in sample teas and traditional foods.
3:25pm-5:00pm	Land based Learning Seasonal Activity (fall)- Deer Skinning and tanning
5:10pm-5:40pm	Depart to hotel
5:40pm-6:00pm	Break
6:00pm-7:00pm	Dinner-Hotel
7:00pm-9:00pm	Dewegan-Drum & Song Interactive Community Social at hotel Includes MC, full drum group, dance demonstrations (dancers in full regalia)
